(36) 5/16" x 2" Lag screws - galvanized

- (1) box 3" Deck screws coated
- (4) 4x4 Posts 4'-10' Treated ground contact
- (8) 2x4 Treated deck boards cross braces
 - See chart for length

For Blind Anchor System (Sold Separately):

(4) 5/8" x 6' #5 Galvanized Rebar (not included)
(24) 5/16" x 1 1/2" Lag Screws (not included)

Note: For simplified assembly, Summit Outdoors recommends using structural lags, such as Saber Drive Construction Lag & Timber Screw (part # 51952), in place of the described 5/16" x 2" traditional lags. Structural lags do not require pre-drilled holes.







Step One - Install Elevator brackets

- 1.1- Lay the shadow hunter blind on its back door side up. Prop the bottom front of the blind up on a block. Careful not to scratch or bend the aluminum.
- 1.2- Measure 1 1/2" from each corner and make a line. Use the Elevator to mark and pre-drill 9/64" pilot holes to avoid splitting the frame member. (Repeat all 4 sides)

Step Two

- 2.1- Remove any screws from the blind that would keep the Elevator plate from sitting flush.
- 2.2- Secure the brackets with 2" lag screws in the bottom four holes to finish mounting the brackets to the blind.

Step Three

- 3.1- Insert the 4x4 legs into the Elevators.
- 3.2- Hold the legs in place for the optimum angle when tightening lag screws.
- 3.3- Pre-drill 9/64" pilot holes to avoid splitting the leg.
- 3.4- Secure the legs with 2" lag screws in the front two holes and the outside hole.
- 3.5- Optional Adjustable Ladder Platform should be installed at this time. Skip to 8.1 if you decide to add the ladder.

Step Four - Leg Bracing


- 4.1-Screw 2x4 cross members to the outside of the two outside legs on each side.
- 4.2-Screw 2x4 cross members to the inside of the top and bottom legs. (See diagram)
- 4.3-Slowly lift up blind standing it up right on the legs.






Anchoring your Blind or Platform: It is very important that your blind or platform is anchored to avoid injury or damage. Soil and
